State, Nation: Forward for Life

Judge Neil Gorsuch was confirmed by the U.S. Senate on Friday, April 7 to become the 113 Justice of the U.S. Supreme Court. He was sworn in the following Monday, fulfilling President Trump& promise that his first Supreme Court pick would be someone in the mold of the late Justice Antonin Scalia.

Justice Scalia, we know, was pro-life. Justice Gorsuchøs convictions are by all indications very similar. Just as importantly, however, Gorsuch believes in following the actual words of the Constitution and the original intent of its framers.

Justices like Neil Gorsuch would never have produced the Roe v. Wade decision, which has no basis whatsoever in the Constitution. If President Trump appoints even one more Justice in the mold of Scalia and Gorsuch, the Roe decision will be in serious jeopardy, to say the least.

Despite all the worthy efforts to save

babies over the past 44 years, Roe v. Wade continues to ensure that hundreds of thousands of unborn American children will continue to be killed every year. Roe is the bulwark of the anti-life, right to abortion movement.

That is why enemies of the right to life fought tooth and nail to block the Gorsuch nomination. Pro-abortion forces in the U.S. Senate tried to prevent a final up or down vote by using the õfilibusterö as a partisan weapon, something that was unheard of in presidential nominee confirmations until about 15 years ago. They would have succeeded if the Republican leadership had not permitted a simple majority (instead of 60 votes) to clear the way for a final decision. The Senate went on to confirm Gorsuch, 54-45.

Three democrats voted to confirm, but not Senator Robert Casey, Jr. of Pennsylvania. Casey said he did õnot believe that Judge Gorsuchøs judicial approach [would] ensure fairness for workers and families in Pennsylvania.ö What about fairness, one might ask, for Pennsylvania@ babies, who are in immanent danger of losing their lives?

Moving Pennsylvania Forward

Pennsylvania is moving forward with legislation to (1) end an especially disturbing method of abortion in which the baby dies from dismemberment, and (2) protect babies from abortion in the sixth month. The Pa. senate approved a bill to accomplish both objectives, S.B. 3, by a vote of 32-18 on February 8. Erie

state Sen. Dan McLaughlin voted against the bill. His stated objection is that there is not an exception for 6-month babies with a defect. Please contact Sen. Laughlin and urge him to rethink this kind of disability-based discrimination. S.B. 3 and a similar bill, H.B. 77, are now awaiting action in the state House of Representative, so please ask for your representative@s full support.

Oratory Contest Winners

People for Lifeøs annual High School Oratory Contest was held on April 15th at the Blasco Memorial Library. First place went to Peter Caulfield, 15, a high school junior, and second place went to Timothy Caulfield, 18, a high school senior. Peter spoke about lethal medical experimentation on human embryos. touching on its similarities to primitive forms of human sacrifice. Timothy spoke about end of life issues including: doctor-prescribed suicide, active euthanasia, and the circumstances under which a person may properly choose to forego life-extending medical treatment. PA Judicial Candidates

The following Pennsylvania statewide judicial candidates are recommended by the Pennsylvania Pro-Life Federation Political Action Committee: Sallie Mundy (R) is recommended for the state Supreme Court. Bill Caye (D), Emil Giordano (R), Wade Kagarise (R), Mary Murray (R), Paula Patrick (R), and Craig Stedman are recommended for the state Superior Court. Bryan Barbin (D), Christine Fizzano Cannon (R), and Paul Lalley (R) are recommended for the state Commonwealth Court.

In the primary election on May 16, you will only be able to vote for candidates from your party. You will be allowed to choose up to four candidates for the state Superior Court

and up to two candidates for the state Commonwealth Court. However, it is perfectly acceptable to vote for fewer candidates if you so choose.

There is a crowded field of 20 candidates in these three races; only the candidates that are recommended by the Pro-Life Federation PAC are mentioned here.

Candidate Survey for the May 16, 2017 Primary Election

Our survey questionnaire was mailed to 152 candidates seeking election in the following races within Erie County: All county government races, all Erie City races, the Fairview, Harborcreek, and Millcreek township supervisor races, and all school board races.

- 1. LEGAL PROTECTION PRIOR TO BIRTH If changes to the Roe v. Wade decision make it possible, would you approve or disapprove of a law prohibiting abortion except when necessary to prevent the death of the mother? Please circle "Additional Exceptions" if you would support such a law, but only if additional exceptions were stipulated, and please note the exceptions you would require.
- 2. LATE TERM ABORTIONS Should abortions be prohibited after 20 weeks gestational age (18 weeks from conception, a point in human development when the fetus/baby is mature enough to experience pain, hear her mothers voice, and in, if necessary, undergo surgery in the womb)? Sixteen states currently provide this protection.
- **3. INFORMED CONSENT** Do you support the provisions of the Pennsylvania Abortion Control Act that require abortion providers to offer basic information to a woman who is considering an abortion, including information about medical risks, alternatives to abortion, the probable gestational age of the unborn child, the availability of detailed information (provided by the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania) about fetal development

A candidate running for Erie City Council objected to the term odoctor-prescribed suicide,ö which was used in the questionnaire she received from People for Life. She felt it was õbiasedö and misleading. (See õCandidate Comments.ö)

Well yes, our questions may very well reflect a bias in favor of human life, but we decided to see if the term in question seemed õmisleadingö to some nationally prominent experts on euthanasia and end of life issues: Rita Marker, executive director of the Patient & Rights Council and Wesley Smith, a senior fellow at the Discovery Institute.

In the first place, as Wesley Smith noted, a physiciang prescribing lethal doses of one or more drugs is, indeed, a essential element in the suicide process.

But when doctor-prescribed suicide is legalized, doesnot the doctor play a purely passive role unless the patient spontaneously announces that he or she wants to end his or her life? Just stop and think about that. Most of us are familiar with the term õinformed

consent.ö Rita Marker explained that a doctor is legally bound to present all the options and treatments that are available to the patient. Failing to do so is to invite a malpractice suit.

But a doctor would never emphasize or recommend one course of treatment over another, right? If you dongt think so, you have probably never spoken with many women who have received an adverse fetal diagnosis (õyour baby is not perfectö). In these cases, abortion is not simply mentioned; it is usually quite firmly recommended. In fact, it is quite often expected by physicians and staff alike.

The candidate also mentioned that doctors can only abet a suicide if the patient is õcogentö (i.e., clear, lucid, rational). õNonsense,ö we were told! The assisted suicide laws provide no criteria pertaining for evaluating the patient s competence for such a decision; the laws only require that the patient is, basically, capable of responding with a oyeso or a ono.o

So remember: Always say õdoctorprescribed suicideö! õPhysician-assisted suicideö is the misleading expression. A

> licensed physician is far, far more than merely a passive assistant in this deadly process.
