Office Move, Consolidation Mark 10th Anniversary of Erie Abortion Facility

Last May we learned that it would be necessary to vacate our Alternative Choices for Women office in the 1611 Peach St. Professional Building by the end of June. A major rearrangement of our W. 26th St. office was then required, as well as the transfer of all the office equipment and lots of other materials from the Professional Building. It was amazing to see how much ostuffo we accumulated during our 10 years at ACW!

The extra office space at the Professional Building was very helpful, but our mission ó to deal with the õAmerican Womenøs Servicesö abortion facility that had been established there ó was fully completed.

It is now a relief to have all of our operations once again located under one roof.

We think our tenure at the Professional Building was largely responsible for the demise of the abortion facility, and the one in State College as well. Space does not allow for a full retelling of the story, but suffice it to say that, thanks to information we were able to uncover, two of the four doctors who did the baby killing in Erie were investigated by the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania. One of the two was fined \$50,000 and had his medical license revoked and the other moved to South Carolina soon after being investigated. We were also able to quickly identify another doctor who never returned to the abortion facility after we arranged to have 100 people picket of his office in Meadville.

The baby-killing finally came to a halt in February of 2007, and American Womenøs Services fully vacated the Professional Building in December 2011.

The W. 26th St. office (what we were previously calling the ŏMain Officeö) will now be open on most weekdays from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. Please drop in to say hello and check out the recent upgrades. Donøt make a special trip, though, unless you call ahead to make sure that someone will definitely be there.

The Erie and northwestern Pennsylvania pro-life communities fought a good fight against American Womenøs Services and its owner Dr. Steven Brigham. Much pro-life work remains to be done, however.

Our battle with the abortion facility was only a skirmish in the larger battle to protect those being led away to slaughter and to restore a sense of compassion for the most defenseless among us. We remain up for the fight, with new recruits and more õyoung bloodö joining our ranks all the time.

The truth is that AWS and its owner Dr. Steven Brigham are, relatively speaking, minor symptoms of the evil afoot in our nation. The vital center of the anti-life monster is to be found in the institutions of government and pro-abortion government officials that ensure the killing will continue unabated. The biggest obstacles at the moment are pro-abortion majority on the U.S. Supreme Court and, of course, the profoundly pro-abortion Obama administration.

Pennsylvania rejects Obamacare abortions

As Pennsylvanians sign up for federallysubsidized and managed health insurance through the Obamacare insurance exchange, they will *not* have be worry, as will many other Americans, about being forced to pay abortion surcharges or struggling to find a plan that does not pay for abortion.

That is because overwhelming majorities in both houses of the Pennsylvania General Assembly along with pro-life Governor Tom Corbett enacted H.B. 818 earlier this year. The new law prohibits insurance plans offered through the federal exchange from

paying for abortion, except when necessary to prevent the death of the mother and in properly-reported cases of rape or incest.

H.B. 818 was approved by a nearly 3 to 1 margin in the state House and a nearly 2 to 1 margin in the state Senate. Governor Corbett signed the bill on June 17.

1. LEGAL PROTECTION FOR THE UNBORN

If changes to Roe v. Wade make it possible, would you favor the enactment of a law prohibiting abortion or prohibiting abortion with exceptions? (Please specify what exceptions, if any.)

2. LATE TERM ABORTIONS

Pennsylvanians will still be spent, however, to subsidize abortion-on-demand in other states.

All of our northwestern Pennsylvania state legislators cast pro-life votes in favor of H.B. 818, EXCEPT for state Sen. SEAN WILEY (D-District 49) and state Rep. FLO FABRIZIO (D-District 2), who voted FOR taxpayer-funded abortion on demand.

Please thank the following state legislators for voting to prevent government-funded abortions in Pennsylvania: Sen. Scott Hutchinson, Sen. Bob Robbins, Rep. Ryan A. Bizzarro, Rep. PA Superior Court Race

In the race for Judge of Superior Court, democrat Jack McVay, Jr. is running against republican Vic Stabile. The Pennsylvania Pro-Life Federation is recommending Vic Stabile for the office. No Supreme Court or Superior Court judges are recommended for retention.

Beware of 'pro-life' candidates

When a political candidate tells you that he or she is õpro-life,ö that candidate has in fact told you nothing at all.

Sean Wiley, campaigning for the state Senate last year, insisted that he was õprolifeö and took umbrage at the suggestion that he was not pro-life. He often responded to questions about his position on abortion with a litany of ways in which he was involved with the Catholic Church. Wiley was officially backed by Planned Parenthood, the nation biggest abortion provider, and he has already voted for federally subsidized abortion on demand.

Kathy Dahlkemper constantly hyped herself as a õpro-life democratö during her run for Congress. Her priorities, however were such that she helped enact the largest continued on page 3

expansion of abortion in history by voting for Obamacare, which included massive subsidies for insurance plans that pay for abortion as routine health care. Last year Dahlkemper actively campaigned for one of the most radical promoters of abortion ever to hold a federal office, as a national co-chair of õCatholics for Obama.ö

A candidate for state representative in west Erie County approached us during Dan Rice Days, just a few years ago, gushing with praise for our pro-life efforts and practically condemning women who had made the mistake of getting an abortion. Asked if he supported legal protection for the innocent unborn, his response went something like: õAbsolutely not! We have too many laws on the books already.ö That candidate continued to pass himself off as õpro-lifeö throughout the rest his campaign.

Outreach and Education

õKristallnachtö was a series of coordinated attacks against Jews and Jewish businesses throughout Nazi Germany and parts of Austria on 9-10 November 1938,

carried out by paramilitary forces and non-Jewish civilians.

Next to legalized abortionon-demand, the Jewish Holocaust during World War II is arguably the most terrifying example of a structured, governmentsponsored system of murder in the history of the human race. That human beingsøinhumanity toward other human beings can play out on such a massive scale and with such scientific õefficiencyö in a modern, industrialized nation is as mysterious as it is frightening. understand as much about these kinds of õorganized crimesö as we possibly can.
